ADVICE FOR GRADUATES

Investing in Yourself has the Greatest Return on Investment

They say hindsight is 20/20 and you learn from your mistakes but here's a tip! You don't have to make them all yourself. You can learn a lot from looking back on someone else's, and it feels like I have made them all. I started my career in dentistry at the Medical University of South Carolina and became an AAWD member in my student chapter as a first-year dental student in 2003. After graduation, I entered private practice when I purchased an existing dental office. It's hard to believe that was 15 years ago. I've learned a lot since then and I hope sharing some of what I learned (mistakes and all!) will make life easier for those of you entering private practice (or any career path) as you get started.

Dental equipment reps will always try to sell you a new piece of equipment by telling you how much money you can make with it, but spend that money on yourself first. You won't regret it! You may be finished with dental school, but learning never stops in dentistry. In your first year of practice, take as much CE as you can in a variety of topics. They can be online webinars or local courses. You don't have to spend a lot of money but you want to expose yourself to as much as possible. Once you figure out what interests you, start investing in at least one intensive course every year on that topic. The practice I purchased had a lot of elderly patients with complex dental problems. I needed guidance on how to treat them and I was fortunate to get involved with one of the most renowned CE groups early on in my career. It changed my practice forever. I learned so much there but more than anything I learned to keep improving my skills. Time goes by quickly but if you start this right away you'll find yourself becoming an expert in something you love in a few short years. It keeps dentistry exciting for you and helps set your practice apart from others.

While you are investing in CE and your practice, don't forget to invest in self-care as well. Dentistry is physically and mentally demanding. Give your body and your mind opportunities to rest. Make time for things you enjoy, and, if time is tight, try to incorporate them into your work day. Do some yoga and stretching with your team at morning huddle. If you love travel, check out a CE course in a city that you've always wanted to explore. When your body says slow down, listen. Even if you can only take a short break. Find a quiet spot, breathe, stretch. Then start again. A healthy body and mind contribute to your success in dentistry more than anything else. I learned this the hard way. Too often I felt there was no time to slow down when my body told me it needed rest. I ended up sick or injured every time, and recovery was always more than I anticipated. In dentistry, we teach our patients that prevention is cheaper, faster and better than treating disease. We need to apply this to ourselves as well. Don't be afraid to invest time and money in yourself; after all, YOU are your greatest asset.
