From Nursing to Dentistry: Dr. Sam's Journey in Academic Leadership By: Tawana K. Ware, DDS, MSD, FACD, FICD

Samantha Parad, DMD, RN, serves as Assistant Professor in the Division of Medically Complex Patient Management, Dept. of Comprehensive Care at Tufts University SOD. Her inspiring journey from nursing to dentistry has led to her recent selection as the inaugural recipient of the ADEA/GHMF/AAWD Woman Dentist Tuition Scholarship for Professional Development. This prestigious award enabled Dr. Parad to attend the ADEA Emerging Leaders Program, further solidifying her position as a rising star in dental academia.

#### The Scholarship and Program

The scholarship, sponsored by the Gillette Hayden Memorial Foundation (GHMF) on behalf of AAWD, supports the future of women dentist leadership in AAWD and the dental profession. The GHMF, established in 1930 to honor Dr. Gillette Hayden, has a rich history of supporting women in dentistry.

The ADEA Emerging Leaders Program is designed to provide promising early-career faculty with the guidance, insight, and skills needed to build an academic career. This year-long program includes an intensive meeting where fellows engage with senior leaders in dental education, followed by ongoing interactions with peer groups and advisors to develop research projects on emerging trends in academic dentistry.

#### A Multifaceted Background

Growing up outside of Boston, Dr. Parad, initially pursued a nursing degree at the University of Pennsylvania. During undergrad, she volunteered on Penn's mobile dental bus, which sparked her interest in dentistry. After working as a nurse for two years, she decided to switch gears and apply to dental school.

Dr. Parad's path to dentistry was unconventional. She took advantage of a unique program at Tufts that allowed her to apply to dental school before completing all the prereqs. This opportunity, coupled with her nursing experience and her family's dental practice, solidified her decision to pursue dentistry.

#### **Transitioning to Academia**

After graduating from dental school in 2020, Dr. Parad completed a GPR at Massachusetts General Hospital through Harvard's program. This experience reignited her interest in academia and led her to accept a faculty position at Tufts in July 2022. As the youngest faculty member in her division, Dr. Parad found herself navigating the complex world of dental education.

"I didn't know really what direction to go in because I wanted to stay connected to all the different parts of dentistry," she recalls. Her role at Tufts allows her to blend her nursing background with her dental expertise, particularly in the care of medically complex patients.

#### The ADEA Emerging Leaders Program Experience

Dr. Parad describes the program as eye-opening: "I think it was realizing how much I didn't even know about my position or what I could do or the potential possibilities." The program covered various topics, including personality types in leadership, difficult conversations, and career advancement strategies. One of the most valuable aspects of the program for Dr. Parad was the opportunity to connect with peers from dental schools across the country. "It was nice to see how they problem-solve something else, and I could bring it back to my university," she notes.

#### Looking to the Future

Participating in the ADEA Emerging Leaders Program has already had a significant impact on Dr. Parad's career trajectory. She has taken on new leadership roles, including serving as the Director of Corporate Relations for AAWD and joining the board of her State Dental Society. Looking ahead, Dr. Parad, aspires to move into higher leadership positions within academia, potentially as a division head or department chair. She is also excited about expanding her research portfolio, with a current project focusing on the accuracy of AI in dental diagnosis.

Dr. Parad's journey from nursing to dentistry, and now to dental education leadership, serves as an inspiration for young professionals in the field. Her story highlights the importance of pursuing opportunities, embracing diverse experiences, and continuously seeking growth in one's career. As she continues to develop her skills and contribute to dental education, Dr. Parad remains grateful for the support she has received. "I felt so lucky and fortunate to have that experience," she says of the ADEA program. With her dedication and newfound leadership skills, Dr. Parad is poised to make significant contributions to the future of dental education.

#### **Opportunity for Others**

The ADEA/Gillette Hayden Memorial Foundation/AAWD Woman Dentist Tuition Scholarship for Professional Development continues to be available for other aspiring women leaders in dental education. This scholarship supports professional development activities for women dentist faculty in the early stages of their careers (up to three years of experience). It is designed to promote the advancement of women dentists who have demonstrated leadership potential in academia.

Participation in the ADEA Emerging Leaders Program, supported by this scholarship, is designed to improve attendees' teaching abilities, increase their leadership skills, and advance their understanding and mastery of other elements critical for a successful academic career. Women dentists interested in this opportunity are encouraged to apply and take the next step in their leadership journey. The 2025-26 ADEA Emerging Leaders Program will be held in July 2025, at the ADEA office in Washington, DC.
