I have known Dr. Temple-Goins since she was a dental student and have watched her career blossom in the state of Oklahoma.

As a winner of the scholarship, Dr. Temple-Goins will receive eight consulting sessions with Shelly V. Short of <u>ZUMWOHL</u> <u>Consulting Services</u>. Ms. Short has been in the dental field for more than 35 years and has consulted and coached since 1996. Prior to owning her own company, she worked for an international practice management company. She now consults extensively in the United States, but has also consulted in the U.K., Denmark, Switzerland and Italy.







Now, to tell you a little more about Mary Temple-Goins. She grew up in a family with little dental knowledge and soon had to visit a dentist in an uncomfortable setting. Dr. Temple-Goins admits to being that patient that we all have in our chair occasionally, biting our fingers and fighting us to get out! Fortunately, her mother did not stop with one bad visit, but found a female dentist who knew all the magic words and tricks to calm this little tiger. Soon after her second visit, Dr. Temple-Goins was hooked on actually liking the dentist and going for a visit.

Dr. Goins purchased her first practice, <u>Wynnewood Family Dental</u>, one year ago in Wynnewood, OK. She has witnessed Oklahoma's large population that has little or no access to dental care, resulting in limited dental knowledge. This poor dental IQ and lack of access to care is a driving force behind Dr. Temple-Goins' passion for serving the people in rural Oklahoma. As we who have been in practice for several years know, it is easy for a new practice owner with a heavy load and a lot of passion to burn out too quickly without the right tools and the right coach. Dr. Temple-Goins will definitely flourish under the advising and guidance of ZumWohl Consulting.

Dr. Temple-Goins lives in beautiful rural Oklahoma with her husband Michael and little boy Jamey. She is very active in the community in which she practices dentistry and loves being a part of each and every celebration.
